

Doris Miller's story is one of grit, determination and fortitude. Born in Waco, Texas, in 1919 he served in the United States Navy during World War II, rising from the rating of mess attendant to ship's cook petty officer third class. He was the first African American to receive the Navy Cross, which was awarded to him for his heroism during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on December 7, 1941.

A fullback on his high school football team, he enlisted September 16, 1939, to travel and earn money for his family. He was trained as a mess attendant at the Naval Training Station in Norfolk, Va., and was serving aboard the battleship USS West Virginia (BB-48) when the Japanese attacked.

On the morning of December 7, Miller was hard at work when the first torpedoes struck the USS West Virginia. He rushed to his battle station only to find it destroyed by the first torpedo. He then headed to the secondary gathering location where he was selected because of his strength to assist with moving the wounded captain of the ship to a safer location. Once the captain had been moved, he was ordered



to begin loading anti-aircraft guns to defend the ship. He had never been trained to load or fire these types of guns but did so successfully until the ship was struck again and began to sink. For his efforts and bravery, he was awarded the first ever Navy Cross to be bestowed upon an African American. The medal was awarded to him personally on May 27, 1942, by Adm. Chester W. Nimitz, commander in chief of the United States Pacific Fleet.

His Navy Cross citation reads, "For distinguished devotion to duty, extraordinary courage and disregard for his own personal safety during the attack on the Fleet in Pearl Harbor, Territory of Hawaii. While at the side of his Captain on the bridge, Miller, despite enemy strafing and bombing and in the face of a serious fire, assisted in moving his Captain, who had been mortally wounded, to a place of greater safety, and later manned and operated a machine gun directed at enemy Japanese attacking aircraft until ordered to leave the bridge."

Later, he was assigned to the newly constructed escort aircraft carrier, USS Liscome Bay (ACV/CVE-56), and was on board during the ship's first mission to secure the Makin and Tarawa Atolls in the



Gilbert Islands. On November 24, 1943, before dawn, a single torpedo struck the ship from behind. The torpedo detonated inside the ship, which caused the ammunition stored below deck to explode, shearing the back half of the ship off. The USS Liscome Bay sank in just a few minutes, killing 646 of the 918 personnel on board. Doris Miller was among those whose bodies were claimed by the sea and never recovered.

Cultural Arts of Waco Spearheads New Project

Cultural Arts of Waco is a nonprofit organization that has historically sponsored an annual art festival in Waco, Texas. Now Cultural Arts honors its mission to celebrate and promote the community's diverse artistic and cultural life; develop and enrich its cultural capacity and champion the economic, social and educational benefits of the arts in the greater Waco area and beyond. The Cultural Arts team endeavored to honor an awe-inspiring African American hero while providing a place for remembrance, reflection and learning to honor those who served their country in times of need and those who gave the ultimate sacrifice.

Defining the Memorial

The project set out to commemorate a WWII hero for valor and bravery. However, the memorial's impact increased and grew to have an instrumental role in celebrating positive racial relationships among the citizens of Waco. Since Doris Miller was born and raised in Waco and was the first African American to be awarded the Navy Cross, he was a natural fit.

The memorial incorporates a reflecting pond and a bronze figure of Doris Miller. The feature element, "Many Sailors Make a Ship," is a stainless-steel wall that provides a reference to WWII naval history and specifically the USS West Virginia. Project materials include stainless steel, bronze, concrete, granite, landscaping and water. The entire project measures 17' tall by 230' long by 70' wide. The bronze figure measures 9' tall, the stainless-steel wall is 140' long by 17' tall, and the pond is 60' in diameter.

On quiet days the memorial takes on a calming, more pastoral state. The stepped seating is oriented to provide views toward the perpetual river flow offering opportunities for WWII education, relaxation and reflection. However, during community events the memorial is designed to become an outdoor performance venue. On more lively days, during public activities and performances, the stainless-steel wall activates the main stage plaza by becoming the backdrop to the performance. The seating steps are transformed to community choir risers, the lawn between the stage and the river becomes a natural outdoor audience chamber, and the historic Washington Street Truss Bridge offers elevated viewing of the entire venue. These are the days that will have lasting community impact, where friends and family come together to perform, celebrate community, and honor valor, bravery and heroism.



Black Granite Above and Below the Water

When Brazos Valley Flooring was approached by Darden Commercial Floors to install the granite on the memorial, John Smith of Brazos Valley Flooring knew he would need a trusted and top-quality installation system to comply with the stringent requirements to ensure a job well done. Upon reviewing the scope of the project, all answers pointed definitively to Merkrete, the leader in waterproofing, crack isolation, setting materials and grout technology.

The installation consisted of approximately 5,000 sq. ft. of $24" \times 24" \times 5/8"$ inch black granite. The granite was split between polished and flamed. Polished granite was used in the reflecting pond due to its ease of cleaning, and flamed granite was used in the areas where foot traffic occurs because of its slip-resistant texture. Black granite was used to give the illusion of depth despite the fact at the reflecting pool is just three inches deep.
